- Everyone is in learning mode right now






For "Visitors"

- What does your YouTube Channel or Vimeo page say?













YouTube, Facebook Live, Vimeo, Zoom, etc.


When can you talk about giving and pledging on Sundays?

- Introduction Section
- During Worship: collection, time to make a donation
- Dedication/blessing the gifts
- Announcements
- Messages and links in the Chat function during worship
- Video coffee hour after service

- Worried about being unwelcoming?
- Does it fit with "worship" and "spirituality"?
- What about others in need?
