	Key Elements	Success Factors
Personal Stewardship Conversations	 Visiting stewards to meet with as many pledging families as possible Direct, personal ask 	 Recruiting Training and support Monitoring and nudging Communication to encourage visits
Commitment Sunday	 Single event where most people pledge Extensive build-up of communication and inspiration Leadership event or personal ask 	 Motivational speaker Leadership ask Advance communication Event must be inspirational
Cottage Meetings	 Small group gatherings combining social and pledging Planning, scheduling, and logistics 	 Recruiting Logistics, organization, and process Multiple capable askers: Script
Generalized Communications	 Calendar "Case for Support": key messages and theme Multiple media – Website! Worship! 	 Design and tech capability Warmth and personality Materials for diverse learning styles

Giving Guidance

- Simple, direct, clear
- Guidance adopted and used by the leadership
- UUA giving guide → values-based
- Share giving stories
- Talk about the spiritual grounding for stewardship
- Explain expectations to new members
- Communicate about the state of money in the congregation
- Mission/Program Based Budgeting

Create a communications plan and schedule

- Timing of messages before, during, after
- Know the specific aim of each message participation AND generosity
- Media
- Publications
- Pulpit testimonials
- Letters
- Reporting
- Photos, names, stories

Make it warm and personal – these are <u>your people!</u>

During Pandemic


- ✓ Video Testimonials
